

Extra Instructions For Elements of Art and Principles of Design PowerPoint

In the same MS Word document you wrote your paragraph describing your Element of Art or Principle of Design, copy and paste (in addition to saving a copy of the artwork to your MyPictures folder) the artworks you have found that are good examples of your Element or Principle.

For each artwork, you will also need the following:

1. Title of the artwork
2. The artist's name
3. Date the artwork was created
4. One paragraph of analysis of the artwork. Ask yourself the following questions and answer them as specifically as you can:
 - What's going on in this picture?
 - How does it show the Element of Art or Principle of Design.
 - Be as specific as you can be about what you see in the picture, for example, if there are blue circles all over the picture and one larger, red, circle, the larger, red, circle is the obvious point of emphasis in the picture, and there isn't much variety, just two colors.
5. When you have completed your analysis and cleared it with me, make your MS Word document smaller (use slider on lower right of screen) so you can see all the art at the same time.
 - Decide which order you want to show your slides in, based on the colors and style of the art you have selected. Perhaps you would want to group the slides by the colors of the artworks, all the ones with yellows dominating in one group, blues in another group of slides.
 - Write out this list in another MS Word document organized by slide number and title of artwork.
- 6. PRINT OUT AND HAND IN BOTH MS WORD DOCUMENTS TO MS. MITCHELL!**
7. Decide on a Theme and custom color scheme for your presentation, using your artwork collection as a guide. Remember, you don't want to have a lot of different backgrounds for the presentation; you want ONE Theme/Background that works for all the slides.
8. Think about your Element or Principle, and what kind of music would make a good accompaniment to it. Choose a sound file (mp3 or WAV) from your collection that would be an effective soundtrack to the presentation. Bring the sound file to school.
9. Think of effective Animations of Text or Objects that will make sense with your Element or Principle.
10. Assemble PPT using the ideas/sound files/animations from 7-9 above. Rehearse timing so you have adequate time to talk about each slide.
11. Test on peers.
12. Package as a self-running slide show and hand in to Ms. Mitchell; in addition, be prepared to present to class.
