

ELEMENTS OF ART POWERPOINT PROJECT

Pull a randomly selected Element of Art or Principle of Design from the box/bag.

Become an expert on that particular Element or Principle, reading the extended article on the one chosen and reading other information on it (Google search using name of Element or Principle in quotes).

Write an in-depth description of it, using your own words and what you've learned from at least three different sources (cite sources, please).

Search the internet for artwork that shows that particular Element or Principle well, and is NOT included in the articles you've read. Save these pictures to your MyPictures folder.

Write down the main points about each piece of art (title, artist's name, date created) to include on each slide. Then write a short paragraph of description showing how this particular piece of art displays the Element of Art or Principle of Design. These will either be placed on the same slide as the art, or on a following slide.

Look at the collection of artwork you've acquired. Note things they have in common, and things that are different. You will want to be able to talk about these things in your presentation, so type them in your Notes section when you finally create your slides.

Decide the sequence in which they will appear in your PPT.

Create a new PPT document. On Title slide, the name of your Element or Principle, and your name.

Choose Theme, Background, Fonts, Colors.

Assemble artwork and writing in a pleasing sequence. **THE LOOK OF YOUR POWERPOINT SHOULD REFLECT THE ELEMENT OR PRINCIPLE YOU ARE WORKING WITH.**

Insert slides for your descriptions, and copy what you've written. PROOFREAD carefully and make corrections.

In this PPT, you will be expected to use transitions and animations; remember, these should be consistent throughout the slide show and support, not overshadow, your content.

You will be presenting this PPT to the class.
